### Early Admission Exercise (EAE)

EAE is an aptitude-based admissions exercise that allows you to apply and receive a conditional offer for admission to Polytechnic (Poly EAE) or ITE (ITE EAE), based on your aptitude and interest, before taking your GCE N-Level or O-Level exams.

### **ITE EAE**

ITE EAE portal will open on 18 May 2020 and you can apply online at the ITE website. List 3 choices in order of preference and do 1 write-up (100 words) on each course. Find out more at these sites:

## Other Aptitude Admission Exercises for GCE O Level Students

## <u>Direct School Admission - Junior Colleges</u> (DSA-JC)

DSA allows students to apply to a DSA school before taking the GCE O-Level examinations. The application starts from early May and the application period, procedures and selection criteria differs from school to school, please check the individual JC website for details.

Students can apply based on talent areas that may not be demonstrated at the O-Level examinations. Examples of Talent Areas range from Sports, Performing Arts, Debate, Science, Mathematics, Languages and Humanities to Leadership.



#### **DSA SOTA**

The application starts from March 2020 and students will be shortlisted in June 2020 for individual auditions, portfolio presentations, interviews.

## **Different Degree or Double Major?**

With a double degree programme, you are certified with two separate degrees. When you double major, you graduate with one degree, but with two or more areas of specialisation or disciplines. You may also have a degree with a major, and a minor in a secondary field.



A double degree is usually more suitable for students who have multiple interests and are determined to obtain separate recognised qualifications for each of their respective fields of interests. Most likely, these students also intend to seek employment in an area related to both of their degrees, or plan to switch careers later on in their career path.

Double major tracks are usually suitable for students with a primary interest in one field, and would like to be equipped with knowledge and skills in a different field which may help them have a future advantage over others in the industry and/or careers they have in mind.

## What's your story?

Had the conductor and composer, Mr Wong Kar Chun, taken the path of his schoolmates after his A-levels more than a decade ago, he might have specialised in Physics instead.



"I was at a crossroads... My peers were doing quite well, getting into the top schools in (the) Ivy League. At that point when (Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music) offered me a full scholarship, I told my parents this was where I wanted to make a final decision. I'd always wanted to be a professional musician." Mr Wong Kar Chun said.

His parents supported him every step of the way, he added, even though there were no musicians in his family back then. "They saw my interest in music and there was never once where they said I should focus on my studies and stop practising the trumpet or anything," he said. "That really encouraged me to pursue a very balanced education."

### What should I put in the **EAE** course write-up?

The write-up should demonstrate your strong aptitude and passion in course-specific areas. You may start with how your interest come about, or why this field fascinates you. List what you have done so far that are relevant to the course. For example, if you are applying for the Information Technology related courses, mention about your knowledge in computers, coding, or websites you have built. Talk about your CCA, responsibilities, or VIA activities, that prove your ability to do the related tasks, or your qualities to take up the related job role in future (for example, being the school newsletter's editor, if you are applying for Communications type of courses). You may read up more on the tips shared by Ngee Ann Polytechnic, or THE GUIDE from Temasek Polytechnic for write-up samples, or see your ECG Counsellor, Ms Corinne, for further guidance (email: mailto:corinne\_tan\_cheng\_hong@schools.gov.sg).

### What is a Portfolio?

It is an organised collection of evidences that showcase what you have accomplished both in and outside of school. It contains samples of your work, your accomplishments, relevant skills and experiences. It can be a Digital Portfolio and/or Hardcopy Portfolio. Do organize it in a logical, easy-to-read manner. Make it sharp and interesting. If you are interested in Design & Digital Media courses, Nanyang Polytechnic organizes a series of <u>SIDM Portfolio Workshops</u>. Another good reference is THE SCHOOL OF DESIGN GUIDE published by Temasek Polytechnic.

## Can I apply for both DSA & EAE?

Yes, you can participate in DSA and EAE concurrently, however, you can only accept one offer. Students found to have accepted both DSA and EAE offers will be disqualified from these exercises, unless they cancel either of their acceptances before the end of the Acceptance Stage. Perhaps you may want to ask yourself which is more suitable for you: a Poly education with an applied learning environment, or a more academic learning environment in a JC.

# I am interested in Science-related industries, but I am not sure which Diploma to apply?



It is daunting and confusing to choose from so many Applied Sciences courses. Now you may consider the new **Common Science Programme (R59)** (CSP). The CSP is another Common Entry Programme which aims to give students more time to discover where your strengths lie before selecting your specialisation.


In the first semester of your first year of study, CSP will equip you with adequate science knowledge and essential life skills required in a range of applied science industries. Towards the end of Semester 1, you will have a better idea which diploma specialisation you prefer to graduate with.

Besides CSP, the other courses under the Common Entry Programmes are: Common Business Programme, Common ICT Programme, and Common Engineering Programme.
